Sabine Soumare: Okay, good afternoon everyone, thank you for joining us today for our information session for applications for the second round of the women entrepreneurship strategy, also known as WES, Ecosystem Fund. My name is Sabine Soumare and I am the Executive Director of the Women Entrepreneurship Knowledge Hub at the Diversity Institute of Ryerson University.

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Sabine Soumare: Before we begin, I would like to first and foremost acknowledge that the work we do takes place on the traditional territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit, The Anishnaabe, the Chippewa, the Haudenosaunee, and the Wendat peoples, which is now home to many diverse First Nations, Métis and Inuit peoples. Our partners across Canada similarly gather on the traditional territory of many Indigenous nations who have cared for this land since time immemorial.

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Sabine Soumare: But if we don't get to all of them, we will be sure to follow up on any unanswered questions, either directly or by updating the Frequently Answered Questions Page on the Ecosystem Fund website. You can also ask your questions in French. I will take care to share them during the session so that we can answer them.

Sabine Soumare: As you know, we are here today because The Honourable Mary Ng, Minister of International Trade, Export Promotion, Small Business and Economic Development, announced a second round of applications for the WES Ecosystem Fund. This fund is a key element of Budget 2021's commitment to accelerate the Women Entrepreneurship Strategy by building capacity in the ecosystem, to support women entrepreneurs to start or grow their businesses.

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Sabine Soumare: Please note that this information session is intended for not-for-profit organizations supporting women entrepreneurs, seeking funding from the WES Ecosystem Fund for the first time.

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Sabine Soumare: I'm joined today by Etienne-Rene Massie, Director General of ISED, to give an overview of the parameters for the second round of applications, and will answer any questions you may have in English or French.

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Sabine Soumare: Welcome, Etienne-Rene!

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Hello and thank you Sabine. Good afternoon to everyone, or good morning, depending on where you are across Canada, and thank you for the kind introduction.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: As I begin I am speaking to you from the traditional and unceded territory of the Algonquin Anishinaabe People. I'm grateful to have the opportunity to present in this territory.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: And I would also like to express my appreciation, as we get underway to the Women Entrepreneurship Knowledge Hub for hosting the event today. The Knowledge Hub continues to be a very good and important partner in our efforts to support the women entrepreneurship ecosystem in Canada.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: And they do great work, however, I would note that the Knowledge Hub is not involved in the design and the delivery of the Women Entrepreneurship Strategy Ecosystem Fund, that is, with us at Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada (ISED), so the Knowledge Hub is being a gracious host and if you have questions with regards to the initiative we will be happy to answer that.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: I am the Director General of the Small Business branch at ISED. One of my teams is responsible for overseeing a number of the initiatives under the federal government's Women Entrepreneurship Strategy.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Today I'd like to provide an overview and elaborate on the eligibility for the ecosystem fund that was recently announced by Minister Ng.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Launched in 2018, the Government of Canada's Women Entrepreneurship Strategy aims to increase women-owned businesses access to financing, to talent, to networks, and to expertise that they need to start up, scale up, and access new markets. The strategy encompasses a number of initiatives, including the Ecosystem Fund.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: The ecosystem fund was designed to provide non-repayable contribution funding to not-for-profit organizations to deliver projects that will help close service gaps and strengthen the capacity within the women entrepreneurship ecosystem.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: The first ecosystem fund supported 52 projects across Canada.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: We funded those projects in 2018 and the details on those projects are available on the Women Entrepreneurship Strategy website and links to that site are being posted in French and English in the chat function.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Budget 2021 which was announced last spring announced additional funding for various initiatives under the Women Entrepreneurship Strategy.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: And of this funding, \$25 million has been allocated to support a new call for proposals for the Ecosystem Fund.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: In a nutshell, this second call will support, not-for-profit organizations not previously funded under the call. It is designed to strengthen capacity and address ecosystem gaps for diverse and or underserved populations of women entrepreneurs.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Selected projects will be national or multi-regional in scope, and a multi- regional project is one that serves five or more provinces or territories.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Projects must serve clients and be delivered in both official languages and I'd like to take some time today to discuss who can apply, what types of projects that will be supported under the fund, and what will be required in an application.

Etienne-Rene Massie: Links to the program guide are going to be posted in the chat function, and I will be referring to them throughout the presentation and I would encourage you to read through the guide and validate your application against the guide, as you develop it as you go on.

Etienne-Rene Massie: So first I'd like to discuss eligibility, which is outlined in section B of this guide. This call here that we are talking about today is open for Canadian-based not for profit organizations which operate at a local, regional or national level and fall into one of the following categories.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: They are business or entrepreneur support organizations, they're research or innovation hubs, they're organizations that certify diversity suppliers in Canada, Indigenous organizations or business accelerators and incubators.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: And organizations that apply must have been in operation for a minimum of one year, as of the deadline for submission, which is March 15 2021.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: The submission deadline is March 15, 2022 so you have to be operating as of March 15 2021.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: And you have to be able to demonstrate at least one of the following criteria: that you have an established mandate focused on supporting women and/ or women entrepreneurs, and you have existing programming that has been offered in the past year, focused on women entrepreneurs and building skills for women entrepreneurs.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Please note that the recipients currently funded under the WES Ecosystem call for proposals are not eligible to submit applications for this call.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: We recognize and commend the great work that these organizations have been doing and we invite their participation on the future call for proposals under the ecosystem. This is one of two calls into the ecosystem, this first one today, and there will be another call later on. But 2018 organizations can apply as partners in applications that other organizations submit. The next question I'm sure people are asking is when that second call for proposals is coming.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Just stay tuned, keep a watch on our website and we will be communicating further information on that call and just like this one, here, we will work with the Women Entrepreneurship Knowledge Hub to make sure that communication goes out widely in the ecosystem.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: For this call for proposals partnerships between organizations are encouraged, particularly because we're seeking projects that are national or cover several provinces or territories.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: A partnership is formed when organizations operating in a similar sphere come together to deliver an initiative, this could include Community organizations connecting with others that serve similar purposes or clientele across Canada.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Our definition of a partner organization is provided in the glossary of the application guide, but for a partner organization it is fundamental that in the delivery of the proposed project that it is invested in the completion and success of the project through the provision of either financial or non financial contributions.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: In this case, when developing the proposal content that you will be submitting, both the lead applicant and the partner's experience and expertise may be used to demonstrate the skill set and capacity to meet the required assessment criteria and ensure a successful project delivery.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: So, for example, if one Organization has two years of experience in working with underserved women entrepreneurs and they form a partnership with another organization for years in the same field, then the partners can demonstrate in their application that they've collective experience of six years working with the underserved and which will bolster their application.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Similarly, in that, if an applicant organization lacks certain capabilities, for example, delivering in both official languages, they can partner with other organizations that have these abilities to ensure that the program requirements are met. But it is imperative in the application that that be clearly articulated and the supporting information you provide in the proposal you submit.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Partnership applications must include an agreement between the parties and the letter of support from each of the partners that describes their contribution, their roles and responsibilities and, if applicable, any financial or in kind contributions to the project.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: For further information on eligibility criteria I encourage you to consult section B of the Ecosystem Fund guide.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: If you're looking to connect with other organizations to discuss possible partnerships, the Knowledge Hub's Sharing Platform is available to connect those who have an ask with those who have support to give, and that could be a good tool to make those connections. It's a free online platform available at sharing.wekh.ca.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: We'll be putting the link in the chat and if you've never used the platform before you'll need to take a minute to create an account and then you'll instantly be able to post your asks or view asks from others.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: We recommend using the connection category to post or find other collaborators on your application. We also recommend including the wording "seeking ecosystem fund partnership" in the title of your ask just to facilitate the search function as other people will be looking through it.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: And if you have any questions about the sharing platform, you can contact the Women Entrepreneurship Knowledge Hub directly and we can post the link to that email .

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Having discussed who can apply I'd like to discuss what types of projects we're looking for and again the details of this component of the presentation are in section B of the application guide with links being posted now in the chat.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: So eligible focus areas include one or more of the following, so you can work on scale up, supplier diversity, recovery planning and adaptation, supporting start-ups and other areas that will support or contribute to strengthening the network of women entrepreneurship organizations in Canada.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Of note, projects must include some networking and mentorship as one of the components of the project.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: It doesn't need to be exclusively that but we ask that there is part of a project that is related to that activity. Additional information on all eligible activities is outlined in detail in Section B of the guide.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Project budgets for this call proposal are a minimum of \$400,000 and a maximum of \$4 million over the course of the project.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: The operating or administrative costs for delivery organizations are capped at a maximum of 15% of the total amount requested for the project.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Costs that are reasonable, incremental, and required to carry out the eligible activities will be reimbursed and I would encourage you to review all of the eligible and ineligible activities or costs that are outlined in section B of the guide - that's a good reference bar as you're preparing your budget.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: And now like to turn to outline what will be required in your application. So these requirements are outlined in section B-7 of the guide and the links are provided in the chat.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Each application will include a number of documents, so your completed application form and your proposal paper which should be 10 pages maximum 12 point font and double space.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: 12 pages for applicants in French, because of the language, one year of past financial statements audited or review engagement, your incorporation documents, your completed budget detail template and the sustainability plan to cover the period after the funding ends in '24 - '25.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: If you are applying as a partnership, you will need to provide those signed letters of support that we've discussed from the partner organizations, which detail their roles in delivering the projects. Quebec based organizations will also need to confirm that they comply with M-30. We will work with any successful candidate to ensure proper authorizations are obtained from the government of Quebec.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Through the proposal paper each applicant will be asked to elaborate on a number of areas, including how the organization meets the eligibility requirements, who are the key partners in the project and their respective roles, and an overview of the project team. By that we mean the experience in project management in working with women entrepreneurs and diverse /intersectional populations of women, the objectives of the project, the scope and the activities that will be undertaken, including who will be served and how services will be delivered.

Etienne-Rene Massie: Any associated risks and the plan to mitigate those risks when you put your project in place, and you will of course be required to provide a budget for your project.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: And how the activities that you propose to provide will contribute to the planned outcomes of the Women Entrepreneurship Strategy Ecosystem Fund.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: And because this funding is for up until '24 - '25, we will ask you for a sustainability plan once the funding ends.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Section B-5 of the guide provides instructions on how to format the project proposal and the specific details that are being sought for each element of the project proposal. We will encourage interested applicants to review this section closely in advance of preparing an application.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: And now turn to timelines and assessment. So the deadline for applications is March 15 2022 at 12pm Pacific Standard Time.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: We strongly recommend that you submit your application well before the deadline to ensure that there are no unforeseen technical issues at the time of submission as late submissions will not be considered. And I will reinforce that quite strongly, every time we do a call for proposals we do get people who email us two minutes after the proposal, indicating that there are technical issues that impeded them from sending their documents in and, unfortunately, in those cases, we cannot make accommodations. So my plea to you is to definitely apply before the last hour, preferably before the last half day of the application to ensure that, if there are technical issues, you have a plan B to submit your documents.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Throughout the application period if you have questions you can send them to the WES inbox and officials on the team will answer them. We've posted the link to the web to that email address in the chat function.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: However, please note that if you send us questions again at the last minute, we can't guarantee you we will be able to answer.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: In the last 24 to 48 hours there's usually a flood of questions that come in and at that point we can't promise answers within that time, just given what the volume of questions we often get at that point.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Now, once the call for application closes, Innovation Science and Economic Development Canada, the department will assess the application based on the criteria set out in the application.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: When you submit your application through our system, you will receive an acknowledgement that we have received your application.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: And then we will probably go silent, as we usually do as we do our review process, and then there will be decisions that will be indicated and everyone will be advised in writing of their project, of the outcome of their application, it may just take a bit of time, so we ask for your patience as we work through the many applications we expect to get.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Successful proposals under this call for application will be awarded three years of non repayable contribution funding through a contribution agreement that you will sign with the Department of Innovation, Science and Economic Development. This means that successful applicants will receive funding and their project can go up into March 31 2025.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: So an important consideration is that successful recipients will be required to report regularly to ISED for the initiatives.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: This will include quarterly progress reports, annual reports, and a final report. The quarterly and the annual reports also can help us process your claims for those successful applicants to be able to flow money to you, to be able to deliver the services.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: We will also encourage recipients to work with other ecosystem providers and the Knowledge Hub, for the greater benefit of the woman entrepreneurship ecosystem in Canada.

Etienne-Rene Massie: So that concludes sort of the key points of the presentation and that gives us a good half hour, a little more than a half an hour for questions, so I will turn it back to Sabine who will moderate the Q&A portion of the session.

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Sabine Soumare: Thank you Etienne, thank you for this presentation, we do have questions.

Sabine Soumare: Quite a lot of questions, so what I will do I will perhaps start with the French questions, because we have five, and then we'll turn our attention to the English questions and my colleague Wendy Cukier here will help me with that.

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Sabine Soumare: So the first question is from Mariam Coulibaly and her question is, in French, whether it's possible to partner with a private company under this project?

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Étienne-René Massie: Okay, thank you for this question, Sabine. You see, what's important here is that the recipient under the contribution agreement with the department has to be a not-for-profit organization and it is this not-for-profit organization that receives the funding; but partnerships can include private organizations and not-for-profits.

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Étienne-René Massie: So Sabine, given that we have English into French and French into English interpretation, do I need to repeat what I said?

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Sabine Soumare: No, it's all being translated. Thanks.

Sabine Soumare: Next question, Karine Prud'homme.

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Sabine Soumare: Is it possible to partner, or at least submit a joint application, with an educational organization?

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Étienne-René Massie: That's a good question. Once again, the organization receiving the funding has to be a not-for-profit organization of the kind I mentioned earlier for the proposal, meaning an organization whose role is to support entrepreneurship, an organization like an incubator or an accelerator, an Indigenous organization, or a diversity supplier.

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Étienne-René Massie: So a school board can be a partner, but if it's a Quebec organization, steps would have to be taken with respect to M-30 to comply with the Quebec government's Order in Council.

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Sabine Soumare: Okay. Next question, Francine Lapointe: can the project be limited to a single province or does it have to include all the provinces?

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Sabine Soumare: I think you've already answered that, but...

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Sabine Soumare: Perhaps briefly.

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Étienne-René Massie: No, it's worth going over it again. Thanks for the Question, Francine. Our goal with this call for proposals is to fund national and multi-regional projects.

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Étienne-René Massie: And multi-regional is defined as five provinces or territories. We therefore encourage you to partner with organizations in other parts of the country. We mentioned the Knowledge Hub's sharing platform, the Women Entrepreneurship Knowledge Hub, which helps organizations connect and establish ties.

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Sabine Soumare: Thank you. Another question, COVID-related this time, from Nerlande Gaëtan : is there a specific amount for COVID?

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Étienne-René Massie: We're very much aware of the fact that we are still mired in a pandemic and really looking forward to its eventual end.

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Étienne-René Massie: I would suggest that if your programming has a public health measures component, you should mention it.

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Étienne-René Massie: No specific amount is specified for any required health measures, but if there are any for the project, you should tell us about them.

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Étienne-René Massie: And in this pandemic of ours, things could change. And new variants could appear.

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Étienne-René Massie: We hope not, but if that were to happen after project funding has been allocated, we could talk to people here in the department to work towards a solution.

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Sabine Soumare: And the final question in French, if you could take it, Étienne. From Katherine Lanteigne: I think, once again, that some further information was provided about this, but can a partner that has previously received ISED funding be a partner, or would it have to be one that did not receive funding in the first or second round?

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Étienne-René Massie: That's a good question, and it needs clarification. Our goal is to provide funding to new organizations that do not currently have a contribution agreement under the last call for proposals in 2018.

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Étienne-René Massie: However, if you are currently a partner in an agreement, if you have an agreement and want to partner with another organization, we strongly encourage you to do so. It's definitely okay to be in a partnership with other organizations.

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Sabine Soumare: Thank you, Étienne. Wendy over to you for the English questions.

Wendy Cukier (she/her): Thanks, thanks so much, and thank you Etienne and Sabine and all for joining us and as mentioned, we will have a transcript. So hopefully we'll get through the questions.

Wendy Cukier (she/her): I'm going to take a slightly different approach and group the questions together as best I can, as opposed to going through them one at a time, so I hope that works to make space for many of the people who have posed 80 questions.

Wendy Cukier (she/her): So I think there are a number of questions specifically about eligibility and you had mentioned nonprofits there was a question about, does that nonprofit need to be incorporated first off, and then secondly, there was a question about whether the incorporation needed to be provincial or federal or if either was fine.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Thanks Wendy and I appreciate the approach and hold me accountable if I don't answer all the questions here so.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: The first question is yes, you must be a not for profit organization and you must be incorporated as a not for profit to apply.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: The incorporation if you've incorporated under the incorporation act of Canada or a provincial a territorial incorporation act is not important to us, as long as you are incorporated according to a provincial and federal statute.

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Wendy Cukier (she/her): The next question was - you had mentioned, I think that the project needed to be in five provinces or regions and someone just wanted clarity that that includes the territories.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Yes, completely the territories would count as one of those five.

Wendy Cukier (she/her): Another set of questions had to do with the eligibility of previous WES funded projects, so, as you know, with the previous ecosystem funding, there were a number of partnerships, so there might be a lead applicant with partners and the question was could the partners who were funded as part of a previous WES project apply as individuals to lead a project this round.

Etienne-Rene Massie: So thanks for the question. So yes, that is a possibility, so if you were a partner on a previous recipient for WES ecosystem in 2018 you can apply. The important thing that we will look at in those situations is that we will look at the partnerships that are in the new project, and make sure that they meet the objectives of this call for proposals. So it can't be a way to get more funding for a previous project. It has to be focused on what the goal of this call for proposal is.

Wendy Cukier (she/her): Thank you very much, another question that came forward was can an organization be a partner as part of the consortium on one application and lead in other applications, so, in other words, can you be part of more than one application.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: Yes, of course, you can be part of different applications you just need to specify your role on each, in each of the applications you're a part of.

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Wendy Cukier (she/her): OK, the next question has to do with Indigenous organizations and whether or not there would be consideration of, for example, English and Ojibwe as bilingual, meeting the bilingualism requirement, or if the requirement is French and English for all applicants, including Indigenous ones.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: That's a, that's a very good question. I think if there are more than one language, more than one Indigenous language, we would welcome that.

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Etienne-Rene Massie: We would like a preference definitely for both official languages, because that may be warranted, but I think it's a bit of a tricky question, quite honestly, because I do want and we do want as a team to encourage Indigenous organizations to apply.

Etienne-Rene Massie: And we don't want to create a burden, I think, in your application, if you were to apply if you could clearly specify the different Indigenous languages you're going to provide and the scope of which both official languages, you can or are looking to provide.

Etienne-Rene Massie: Yes that works for me perfectly Wendy. I'm just trying to - because there's different incorporation when it comes to financial institutions - so I don't have that offhand.

Etienne-Rene Massie: Yes, so there will be recordings and there will be transcripts of this session available for sure on the financial pieces.

Etienne-Rene Massie: I'm just trying to make sure I get the numbers here right, so the maximum budget is \$4 million for one project and the minimum amount is \$400,000, and that is over the duration of the project.

Wendy Cukier (she/her): Okay, another question is, will projects that support organizations to increase the number of women hired be eligible.

Etienne-Rene Massie: So I'm just trying to sort out what exactly is meant by women hired. Like we are looking, this initiative is to support women entrepreneurs who start businesses or build their businesses or grow their businesses, and as they grow their businesses, they will likely hire employees, so that is part of the overall objectives.
